

5th Grade Passport 2007-2008 Application 5th Graders Ski FREE at Bald Mountain, Pierce, Idaho

Why is there a Passport Program?

The Clearwater Ski Club and its members want all fifth graders to have the opportunity to ski/snowboard. This program is designed to encourage a healthy, safe and fun family activity. Kids are the future of the sport and we want to give them the opportunity to learn to ski/snowboard in their own backyard. The best part about this program is that it provides an excellent opportunity for families to enjoy the mountains together.

Why fifth grade?

Fifth grade is a great age for children to successfully learn to ski or snowboard. We hope that through a positive introduction to the sport, fifth graders will continue to be lifelong lovers of skiing and snowboarding. This program also fosters health and physical fitness for fifth graders and their families.

How does the 5th Grade Passport work?

Simply fill out the application and follow the steps provided. The students will receive their passport in the mail or they may be picked up at the hill. The 5th Grade Passport Program is open to all kids who are in the fifth grade.

What if I don't have equipment?

No worries! Every ski area has equipment you can rent. Look into renting equipment for the entire season if your child does not have equipment. Most area ski shops offer a ski package, which includes skis/snowboard and bindings, boots, and poles for under \$100.00. The biggest disservice you can do your kids is to give them a great ski experience on lousy equipment. Any expert will tell you that equipment has a great deal to do with performance. Make sure they have ski/snowboard boots that fit snug without hurting the feet. Ski boots with front entry (buckles over the top of the boot) will give better performance than rear entry (boots that buckle around the back of the leg). If possible, get shaped skis for your kids. They will greatly improve their ability to make a turn and enhance their feel for the snow.

What if my parents don't ski or snowboard?

Now would be a great time for them to discover the wonders of skiing or snowboarding. Bald Mountain offers ski and snowboard lessons for \$15 per hour. You must schedule these lessons prior to arriving at the hill. If you or your child is a beginner, lessons are recommended. The more they know the better they will do.

How much does my passport cost?

The only cost is a \$10 administration and processing fee. After that, you can ski and snowboard all winter for FREE!

Is there a deadline to apply?

There is no deadline to apply, but it will take about one week to receive your passport after you mail us the completed application. If you bring the application to the hill, your passport will be made on the hill and you will receive it immediately.

2007-2008 Bald Mountain 5th Grade Passport Rules & Regulations

1. The Passport may not be used in conjunction with any other discount or special offer.
2. The Clearwater Ski Club reserves the right to withdraw from the program at any time.
3. The Passport is valid only at Bald Mountain Ski Area near Pierce, Idaho.
4. The Passport may be used at Bald Mountain Ski Area between December 1, 2007 and April 1, 2008.
5. The Passport or use of the Passport may not be transferred or re-sold to any other person, including family members or relatives. Clearwater Ski Club will immediately revoke a Passport if the holder transfers use of the Passport to another person, for monetary consideration or otherwise.
6. The 2007-2008 Bald Mountain Passport is a non-transferable document that entitles the fifth grader to whom it is issued to obtain a one-year season pass, subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the Clearwater Ski Club during the 2007-2008 season.
7. Clearwater Ski Club will revoke and cancel a Passport without notice for any misuse. Passport holders and their parent or legal guardian are responsible for proper use of the Passport at all times.
8. The Clearwater Ski Club reserves the right to modify or cancel the Passport program at any time and to modify or cancel all valid Passports at any time with or without notice. The Clearwater Ski Club is NOT responsible for expenses incurred or opportunities forgone by Passport holders if the Clearwater Ski Club modifies or cancels the Passport program.
9. If a Passport is lost or stolen, notify the Clearwater Ski Club immediately. The Clearwater Ski Club reserves the right to make case-by-case determinations concerning replacement of lost or stolen Passports, but in no event will a lost or stolen Passport be replaced without collecting a \$10 processing fee.
10. Each Passport holder agrees to comply with all rules and regulations of the Clearwater Ski Club, and with all other applicable laws, local ordinances and regulations including the National Ski Areas Association Skier Responsibility Code.
11. An individual is eligible for the Bald Mountain 5th Grade Passport program only once. Individuals repeating all or a portion of the fifth grade do not qualify for a repeat Bald Mountain 5th Grade Passport.
12. If a 5th Grade Passport applicant provides any false or inaccurate information in his or her application, a Passport will not be issued. Any Passport issued to fifth grader who has provided false or inaccurate information will be revoked.
13. All information provided in the application is subject to verification by the Clearwater Ski Club. All information provided in the application becomes property of the Clearwater Ski Club. Information provided by Passport applicants may be used by the Clearwater Ski Club for verification and for market research purposes.
14. The user of the pass, like all skier and snowboarders, expressly agrees to assume all risks inherent in the sport of skiing and snowboarding. The user of the pass also agrees to release the Clearwater Ski Club and Bald Mountain Ski Area, their agents, owners and employees from all liability for injuries or loss from participation in the sport and related activities whether the injuries or loss results from their alleged negligence or any other cause.
15. As the child's parent or guardian, I further agree to defend and indemnify the Clearwater Ski Club and Bald Mountain Ski Area where the pass is used, their agents, owners and employees from all liability for any injuries or loss from participation in the sport and related activities, whether the injuries or loss results from their alleged negligence or any other cause.
